Large rock formations provide a beautiful backdrop to an historic covered bridge that has been photographed by thousands.

Troops camp in spacious campsites with camp-provided wall tents, complete with bunks and mattresses. Campsites also feature latrines, dining flies and picnic tables. A modern Dining Hall provides three tasty meals daily. The swimming pool is inviting on a warm summer day.

Chief Logan Reservation

Often called “the friendliest camp in the country,” Chief Logan Reservation is located about 20 miles southeast of Chillicothe near Ray, Ohio. The camp encompasses 261 acres of remote, Southern Ohio charm. Sproat Lake emerges from the rolling hills and valleys with large, lush meadows.

Chief Logan has a well-equipped Dining Hall, serving meals that are delicious and nutritious. Troops camp in open campsites with camp-provided wall tents, complete with cots and mattresses. Campsites also feature latrines, dining flies and picnic tables. Sproat Lake supports numerous swimming and boating activities.

CLR programs operate on a mostly open and flexible schedule to accommodate your program needs. No Scout is turned away because he is “late” or the session is “full.”

Risk Advisory - Boy Scout Summer Camps

Simon Kenton Council camps have had an excellent health and safety record since the inception and growth of our programs. Summer Camp strives to minimize the risks to participants and advisors by emphasizing proper safety precautions. Most participants in Summer Camp do not experience injuries because they are prepared, are conscious of risks, and take safety precautions. If you decide to attend Summer Camp, you should be physically fit, have proper clothing and equipment, be willing to follow instructions, work as a team with your provisional troop, and take responsibility for your own health and safety. Summer Camp programs and facilities are not risk free, and you should be prepared to listen to safety instructions carefully, follow directions and take appropriate steps to safeguard yourself and others.

Parents, guardians, and potential participants in Summer Camp are advised that journeying to and from Summer Camp, and one's participation in the Summer Camp program, can involve exposure to accident, illness, and/or injury associated with a physically demanding, camp program. Participants may be exposed to occasional severe weather conditions such as lightning, hail, flash floods and heat. Other potential accidents include: injuries from tripping and falling, motor vehicle accidents, shooting sports accidents, asthma and diabetes related accidents, heart attacks, heat exhaustion, drowning, boat collisions, and falls from canoes or boats.

Wild animals are native to natural areas and usually present little danger if proper precautions are taken. Please refer to the Leader's Guide on our web site, speak with previous participants, or call for further information concerning risks and measures that can be taken to avoid accidents.

Simon Kenton Council camps have staff trained in first aid, CPR and accident prevention, and are prepared to assist in recognizing, reacting, and responding to accidents, injuries and illnesses. Medical and search and rescue services are available, however, response times can be affected by location, weather or other emergencies and could be delayed.

Custodial Parent Consent Statement:
